Prize giving will be held on Saturday evening at an offsite location and will incorporate the annual club Christmas function.


We will shortly be asking for both expressions of interest for participating in the exhibition and numbers for prizegiving / Christmas dinner.



Workshop Night

A couple of exhibits were on the table that night and we hurried through the preamble as more pressing things were in the offing namely a night with the club's tool and cutter grinder which was donated to the club by Graham Murray.

Firstly the articles on the table were a lamp stand from Roger Shearer, Duplex water pump bodies from Steve Watson for his Beejax and finally a breakdown of parts for the Club's Ajax regulator. Roger had previously put the arms on show at the general meeting in roughed out form but now they are assembled complete with gears and ready for a sturdy base to be fitted. Steve describe a few trials and tribulations machining the bodies of the water pumps but has made a super job of them and is forging ahead to get them completed.

Repairs to the regulator for the Ajax are proving more the just a quick look at with Bruce Cooper making a new regulator plate then Steve taking the regulator plate and regulator orifice plate to Mike Jack for lapping in. Hopefully we will see the Ajax in action in a couple of weeks.

The main event was education on the tool and cutter grinder learning the various attachments that are used with it and the configuration of finger used to register the flutes of the cutters there is still a lot to cover though as out in industry tool and cutter grinding is it own skill set.

Matthew has made a pneumatic engine that he made for a school project using parts that he sourced from Ebay. He discovered a problem where the flange was not aligned, as the thread was made to imperial standards and the rod was made to metric standard. With some help from Mike Banks, he fixed the rod and got it working at 8psi, though it's rated for up to 100 psi!



Roger was making some arms for a lamp. His Mill isn't working, but that won't stop him! With some work on the laithe, he managed to produce this prototype which looks quite good!



Mike has a new mystery object of the month. He acquired this device from Browns Bay Market. It's a tool weight, rated for between 0.5 to 1 kg and it's designed to make it easy to grab a tool, pull it down and use it, and then return it to where it was before.
